ENTRIES: Entries may be made by mail or at the fairground office up to one week prior to fair. Entry fee is 10% of first place premium per animal, except group classes, which is just 10% of first premium. Entries received after Friday, July 24, 2015, and up until Monday, July 27, 2015, will be 10% of first place premium plus a \$5 late fee per animal. All entries must include a copy of the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and acceptable proof of rabies vaccination. Those entering in Section-1 Full blood/Purebred Boer must also, include a copy of their registration paper. To be eligible for group classes, animals must be shown in their respective individual classes. Market kid class will be judged for slaughter not breeding.

ALL animals exhibiting at the Clinton County Fair must be vaccinated for rabies within 365 days prior to the opening of the fair. Exhibitors should consult with their veterinarian about vaccinating their animals against rabies as soon as possible. Consult the Animal Health Requirements section of this premium book for health requirements for exhibition.

Goats may arrive on Monday, July 27, and must be on exhibit by 12 noon Tuesday, July 28th. They must remain on exhibit until Sunday, August 2nd, at 6pm, unless excused by the superintendent. **All bucks must be removed from the fairgrounds after the show by 10pm on Tuesday, July 28th.** Any entrants who do not comply with these rules will forfeit all premiums.
