Entry Fee - 10% of first place premium

Senior Citizens - 8% of first place premium

All entries close Friday, prior to fair, at 8:00 PM.

All entries must be on exhibit by NOON on Sunday prior to the opening of the fair and remain until 8:00 PM Sunday (closing day of the fair) or you will forfeit your premium money. Late entries will not be judged nor will they be exhibited

All entries must be picked up by 12:00 noon on the Monday, following the close of the fair.

All paintings, drawings, or prints must be matted or framed for hanging.

Photographs must be drymounted, or matted, or framed and prepared for hanging (complete with wire or appropriate hanging material).

Signatures must be covered until judging has been completed. Each entry should be accompanied by a 3 x 5 card with the following information in **Bold Letters**:

Professional - An exhibitor who has in the past or at present earns 1/3 or more of his/her yearly income from the art/craft work. This group includes art instructors, studio photographers, free lance artists, craftspersons, etc.

1st - \$15.00, 2nd - \$10.00, 3rd - \$5.00, 4th - Ribbon

Amateur - Exhibitors over the age of 19 years who do not earn 1/3 of their income from their art or craft work.

1st - \$10.00, 2nd - \$7.00, 3rd - \$3.00, 4th - Ribbon

Youth - Exhibitors who are 18 years or younger. The age of the exhibitor must appear on the entry. Judging will be conducted as follows:

to 10 years

10 to 14 years

14 to 18 years

Senior Citizen - Exhibitors who are age 62 or older
